Now Here is also Nowhere Part I: October 27, 2012 – January 6, 2013

Now Here is also Nowhere is a two-part meditation and non-linear account of how--in making artworks about ideas and intangible concepts-- artists continually question and destabilize the nature of the art object, as well as challenge art historical categories and medium specifity.

The international and multi-generational exhibition includes many works that are "performative", that is, that require participation or activation by the viewer, while others discretely examine the physicality of the body, both in its relation to the construction of forms and/or as a generator of knowledge.

The play of words in the title refers to the fact that in making and experiencing works of art, both artists and viewers are thrust into a state of extreme presence; and although, in modern society we privilege the idea of linear narratives and specific outcomes, artists like the ones included in the exhibition favor a state of open-endedness where artworks remain contingent and meanings are not fixed. This is the nowhere that the exhibition addresses, a place where unknowing is constantly celebrated.

The artworks in *Now Here is also Nowhere* are ephemeral, immaterial, or are deceptively diaphanous; many of them are the result of orchestrated private and/or public actions that remain incomplete. The dialogs and juxtapositions in the exhibition rather than trying to generate true or false answers, seek to highlight the immense potential of contemporary art to be meaningful rather than decipherable.
