BIOS

Sharon Arnold, Founder/Curator, Bridge Productions

Sharon Arnold is a Seattle-based artist, writer, and founder of Bridge Productions. She has independently curated in various renegade spaces as well as SOIL Gallery, Roq La Rue, and most recently was one of four curators for 2015's landmark event Out of Sight Seattle at King Street Station which ran alongside the Seattle Art Fair. Bridge Productions is home to several projects featuring a broad range of contemporary art and literature to create a strong, accessible connection to the arts through publications, monthly art exhibitions, events, collaborations, and curated box sets. Located in the Georgetown neighborhood of Seattle, historically a vibrant hub for artists and performers, Bridge provides a venue which creates the opportunity for artists, makers, patrons, and supporters to convene in celebration and support of the arts.

Elizabeth Brown, Independent Scholar & Educator

Elizabeth A. Brown is an independent scholar, educator, and consultant specializing in contemporary art and the history of photography. From 2000-2011 she was Chief Curator and Director of Exhibitions & Collections at the Henry Art Gallery in Seattle, following positions at the Allen Memorial Art Museum, Oberlin College, and the University Art Museum, UC Santa Barbara. She has curated over 50 exhibitions, including mid-career surveys of Kiki Smith [photographic work] and Lari Pittman [drawings], WOW (The Work of the Work), which explored how contemporary art affects the viewer; and 150 Works of Art, an innovative display of the Henry's permanent collection. Brown earned her B.A. from the University of Michigan and M.A., M. Phil., and Ph.D. degrees, all in the history of art, from Columbia University in New York. She currently teaches at the Photographic Center Northwest and Seattle University.

Amanda Donnan, Curator, Seattle University Art Galleries

Amanda Donnan is the newly appointed curator of Seattle University's art galleries. Before moving to Seattle in 2015, she was assistant curator of contemporary art at Carnegie Museum of Art in Pittsburgh, where she curated solo exhibitions of artists like Duncan Campbell, Corey Escoto, Jacqueline Humphries, and The Propeller Group, and served as assistant curator of the 2013 Carnegie International. She was previously production coordinator at Art21, Inc. in New York.

Michelle Dunn Marsh, Executive Director, PCNW; Founder, Minor Matters

Over the last two decades, Michelle served in executive and creative roles in the fields of art photography and publishing. Her commitment to education, collaboration, and achievement of excellence have defined her career and gained her national recognition. Michelle's professional experience includes fifteen years with Aperture Foundation in New York City, first as a designer and later as deputy director for the organization, and as Co-Publisher of Aperture magazine. She was senior editor of art and design at Chronicle Books, San Francisco, and was a tenured professor in graphic design at Seattle Central Community College. Rock Hushka, Chief Curator, Tacoma Art Museum

Rock Hushka is Chief Curator and Curator of Contemporary and Northwest Art at Tacoma Art Museum and serves as Affiliate Assistant Professor at the University of Washington. Hushka has curated nearly 70 projects including *The Forty Part Motet by Janet Cardiff, A Reworking of Spem in Alium 1573 by Thomas Tallis; Andy Warhol's Flowers for Tacoma; Memories and Meditations: A Retrospective of Michael Kenna's Photography; Mary Lucier: Plains of Sweet Regret; and seventeen major exhibition and catalogue projects for regional artists including three <i>Northwest Biennials*, Building *Tradition: Gifts in Honor of the Northwest Collection; The Romantic Vision of Michael Brophy;* and *Loud Bones: The Jewelry of Nancy Worden*. In 2010, Hushka shared a Research Fellowship from the Warhol Foundation for the nationally touring exhibition *Art AIDS America*.

Nancy LeVine, Photographer, PCNW advisor and faculty

Nancy LeVine is an award winning photographer who has traveled worldwide on a variety of assignments. Her project 'Senior Dogs Across America' has been featured on The Today Show, Evening Magazine and a number of blogs around the world, including The New York Times LENS Blog, BBC, Feature Shoot and Lens Culture. A solo show of these photographs opened at the Houston Center for Photography in 2012 and the book is set to release in spring, 2016 by Schiffer Publishing. Her assignment resume is extensive and it includes Seattle Children's Hospital, Starbucks, and PBS. The first phase of her career was focused on fashion and personalities in New York and Paris. Her work has appeared in numerous publications such as L'Officiel de la Couture (Paris) and The New York Times. She has a book published called A Dog's Book of Truths. Her photographs have been selected to appear in American Photo, The Photo Review, and Vogue as well as in gallery shows in New York and Seattle. The New Britain Museum of American Art collects her work. Nancy completed her Master of Arts degree at NYU/ICP. She currently works on assignment in New York and Seattle.
